We're keen to show off what community-led housing has been able to achieve locally. With our partner community organisation John Eastwood Homes, we'll be holding Open Doors at Birks Court all afternoon from 1pm until about 5pm. Come and have a look round the independent-living bungalows which will very shortly be affordable homes for local people.

To make the occasion more enjoyable, **Todmorden Town Band** will be playing. Light refreshments will be available in one of the bungalows. And, at about 3pm, we will asking the Mayor of Calderdale Cllr Dot Foster to undertake the ceremony to declare the bungalows well and truly open for their first residents.

Birks Court is just over the canal in Walsden, behind the Post Office and near the old Methodist Church. Be warned, though, that there is **no parking** near Birks Court.

Come even if it's wet. We have also booked the next-door parish church in case the weather is truly horrible.

We may need some extra volunteers on the Saturday morning, helping us get things straight. Tasks will include putting up the bunting and putting down the floor covering to protect the new floors.

We may also need volunteers during the afternoon for the refreshments.

Update on the allocations process

We advertised the four CLT bungalows for two weeks in January on the Keychoice system (the bidding system which has taken over from the old council waiting list) and as we expected there was a great deal of interest. We're sorry we can't meet everyone's housing needs.

The fourteen applicants which Keychoice tells us have the greatest housing need have been approached by us and asked to complete a very short supplementary questionnaire. Once the questionnaires are back, our allocations panel will meet and make their decision. Our thanks to Martyn Broadest of Connect Housing and Cath Miller from the council who are volunteering to join CLT trustees on the panel.
